Description: The contents include 72 letters between Elena (or Helene)
Sikorski and her brother. The first 67 are numbered. The final five, from
Nabokov to his brother Kirill, are unnumbered. One is in English to
Trygve Lie, the Secretary General of the United Nations, on behalf of his
sister. All are in Russian, except for those noted.

In addition are two Nabokov English translations of poems included in two
letters to his sister, a drawing, and a letter in holograph.
