The naming of this collection of 22 interviews, 11 letters, nine articles, and five lepidoptera papers and book reviews came from the "BBC-2 (1968)" (work #18) interview. It was printed in *The Listener* magazine on 10-Oct-1968 under the title "Strong Opinions". The only item not originally in English is "On Hodasevich (1939)" (work #56), originally written in Russian.






